Red Eagles Reunion

Reunion 2011

For the person stepping up to the plate for the next reunion, whenever and wherever it may be, I offer the following debriefing.

Reunion planning began about one year out. The first priority was settling on a date and then locking in a hotel. October was chosen because it generally has some of the mildest weather of the year. Of course, hundreds of conventions and thousands of tourists pick October for the same reason-it is the busiest month of the year in Las Vegas. We initially picked the Flamingo Hilton and the weekend of Oct 21-22. As it turned out, the Flamingo was a little too pricey and the 21-22 dates conflicted with previous commitments by members of the reunion committee. The Boulder Station Hotel and Oct 28-29 was a lock—and we began the process.

It takes a crowd to plan and execute a reunion. Our crowd included: Tom Boma, Bob Breault, Mike Cleveland, Doug Daulton, Bob Drabant, Dan Futryk, Ben and Melody Galloway, Neil Henderson, Larry Mason, John Nelson, Gail Peck, Mike Scott, and Phil Young. One of the first tasks was getting the word out to all former members of the 4477th. Ben started with the Spring 2011 newsletter where he provided the basic details-time, place and costs. Ben also established a web link to the hotel to reserve rooms directly. We had reserved 50 rooms and as summer arrived we became worried that there might be more reunion committee members attending than the rest of the Red Eagles. The sign up was very slow!

(no email, mailing address or phone number). Throughout the spring and summer we made a concerted effort to locate the missing Red Eagles, and thereby gained a healthy respect for the monumental job Ben and Bro have been doing for the last few years keeping the roster current.

We had decided that we needed to pad the costs of the activities by about \$5 to cover the cost of "free" giveaways in the welcome packets. The easiest activity to do this was the Friday night golf course function. The cost quote from the golf course was \$10 per person for heavy hors d'oeuvres and free beer and wine, so we added \$5 to that activity. As it turned out, the booze consumption went over (surprise, surprise) and we ended up having to pass the hat Saturday night to recover the additional expenses. For a similar function in the future it should be planned for \$20 per person. The "free" giveaways were a Red Eagle coin and a Red Eagle

We also took on ordering Red Eagle shirts. We didn't want to be "at risk" for the shirt costs, so we chose to invite individuals to custom order color and size ahead of time and mail them out prior to the reunion. It became an all-consuming job of ordering and mailing shirts throughout the summer and right up to the reunion. A total of 144 shirts were ordered and mailed.

Neil Henderson and Doug Daulton (a photographer friend) took on the job of video taping interviews of former Red Eagles during the convention to preserve memories of such a unique organization. Boulder Station provided a quiet, cozy conference room on the second floor. With the Friday function

on base at Nellis, Saturday and Sunday were the only opportunities for scheduling interviews. Paco Geisler had volunteered to emcee the night's activity and he was a real hit. My wife and I had tears in our eyes during most of his stories—and I had heard a goodly number of them before. The group photo sessions up on the stage was an afterthought—one we wished we had anticipated and planned for. We had large 4477th banners, including one in my car, which never made the front pages, and would have been most appropriate for the photo sessions.

All in all, the reunion was a great success, thanks to the hard work of about 15 people. I look forward to the next one when the band of brothers meet again.

Red Eagle Alumni Association (REAA). A meeting was held with a permanent association being established. The initial Board of Directors includes elected members Phil Young (VP), Larry Mason (Sec), Jim Keys, Ike Crawley, Rob Zettel and Mike Scott (Pres) as elected members; permanent members John Nelson (Treas), and Ben Galloway and Bob Breault (Co-Comm/Editors). The preceding are voting members. Subsequent to the meeting, the President (me) appointed two additional non-voting members: Gail Peck (Historian) and Earl Henderson (Director Emeritus).

Future Reunions. The success of the reunion combined with numerous requests to make it obvious that we actually like to meet with each other! Some want the meetings frequently while others thought some time in between would make them more 'special'! So, after some email communications, we have come up with the following: Phil Young has taken the lead for "get together" type events (golf outings, Bar-b-ques, etc) that will take place on a frequent basis (defined as at least once a year).
