ing our Reunion in mid-October. Bluto has provided a superb, overall recap of that event. So, for the benefit of those of you who were either unable to attend or, like me, have a problem remembering, I thought a recap of the business meeting might be in order. It was held on Saturday at 1600 and lasted about an hour.

First, we acknowledged the Board Members and thanked them for their diligence in getting our Association to our full-up, mature status. 2014 Elected Members were (and will be in 2015) Jim 'Bluto' Keys (VP); Larry 'Mase' Mason (Sec'y); Ike Crawley; Neena Wright; Rob 'Zman' Zettle; and me, Mike Scott (Pres). Permanent Members are John 'Admiral' Nelson (Treas); Bob 'Bro' Breault (Co-Editor, Asst Store Manager, Facebook Site); and Ben Galloway (Co-Editor, Store Manager, Keeper of the Roster, Website Guru). Additionally, we have two, non-voting 'Advisor/Emeritus' Board Members, Earl 'Obi' Henderson and Gail 'Evil' Peck (Historian). Phil Young, who did not seek reelection, was also thanked for his work as the past Board VP and 'Store Starter-Upper'.

The next item, Treasury Report, provided some insight into the use of our money. The biggest expense is providing augmenting funds to help keep Memberships' individual Reunion costs at a reasonably affordable number. In this regard, in addition to some admin expenses, we provided a no cost beer call at the Aggressors' Red Eagle Bar; a significant contribution to the golf course reception; and the ability to provide a deposit for the Boulder Station functions (without resorting to using Committee Members' Credit Cards!) Other costs include: annual corporate business license renewal and tax filing (both required for us to maintain our 501c non-profit status); initial purchase of store inventory (basically, self-sustaining from this point on); memorials for deceased Red Eagles (see next paragraph); and the ability to fund pop-up costs for unknown Association requirements. After tabulating 2014 total expenses, we expected to have a balance of over \$5000 in our Treasury. A subject of concern was the fact that out of well over 400 folks that were part of the Red Eagle organization and can legitimately call themselves a 'Red Eagle', less than 25% of them have joined our organization and pay dues to help support what we do.

We discussed a few New Business items.

A. First up was the need to Standardize/Codify Memorials for deceased Red Eagles. In the past, we have

been providing something (flowers, donation, etc) on a reactionary basis that involved contacting survivors for their wishes – and doing so at a time when the family had, understandably, other concerns. It was decided that our policy would be a standard donation in the amount of \$44.77 to the Wounded Warriors organization.

B. Next, we talked about a Red Eagle display at the AF Museum at Wright-Patterson. Museum leadership has indicated the intent to establish a display - the issues are 'when' and 'with what'. Our PoC. Neena Wright has been in contact with the Museum folks. As of this writing, they have not determined the 'when'; however, we have a suggested potential time - see the next paragraph. As for the 'what', that is in our (all of us) ballpark - they need stuff! But, to preclude our sending them a boatload of duplicate or unusable items, they must first determine whether or not the stuff we have is something that will work for the display. To that end, the museum folks have provided a methodology to get information (pictures, description, significance, etc) on memorabilia any Red Eagle might have to the museum for their consideration. We will make that procedure available in a separate emailing in January. In the meantime, check your memorabilia - if you have an item(s) you believe might be something that fits the bill, clean it up, take some digital pictures of it, and wait for the email for further instructions. We will also create a permanent 'how to' reference for inclusion in the Spring Newsletter and each subsequent edition.

C. The third item involved setting a date and site for the next Reunion. After discussing pros and cons, it was decided to have the next Reunion in two years, 2016; and that the site would be the Dayton, Ohio area with the objective of centering it at the AF Museum at Wright- Patterson. A goal for that reunion is to have it coincide with the opening of a Red Eagle Display (ref paragraph B); the Reunion Committee will strive to make that happen. Since the 2014 reunion, Ted 'Gabby' Drake has agreed to lead the 2016 Reunion Committee and is in the process of forming it up. Ted has already been in contact with the Museum; although their reservation calendar was quickly filling, Saturday 10 Sep 2016 was a favorable autumn open date so the Board voted to nail it down. When details have turned from jello to cement, the actual agenda will be published - expect that to be in early 2016. Until that time, just know that the next Red Eagle Reunion will be held at Dayton Ohio during the weekend of 10 September 2016. Save the date!

D. We had less than 20 voters in the 2013 Board

Member election which was conducted via email. Consequently, with the objective of getting more participation, we also voted to delay the next election from 2015 to 2016. That will enable us to hold the election coincidental with the reunion (during the business meeting); and match the 'every two years' election requirement with each subsequent reunion (assuming we retain a two year reunion cycle).

E. A question was raised at the end of the meeting, "What exactly are we allowed to talk about concerning the Red Eagles". The response was two-fold: first, "No document exists that specifically spells out all the particular areas that that question entails"; and, second, the guideline answer is, "Our operation has been declassified and we are allowed to talk about the 4477TEF/TES as it pertains to our operations at Tonopah Test Range Airfield during the period of our official time of existence, summer 1978 to spring 1988." To amplify, we can talk about our MiGs, but not their source. We can talk about our base (including its construction), people, operations, maintenance and logistics; and some, but not necessarily all, of the corollary/ancillary support organizations that may have interacted with us. At one time or another, most, if not all of us, were assigned to other organizations that were also classified - their classification/ declassification status remains in their purview. If you have a question in your mind, ask yourself if the subject aligns with the above. If the answer is yes, you are okay. If it is no, don't talk about it. If you are unsure, use your best judgment - my advice is to defer to the side of conservatism. Hope that helps!
